Quincy Elks Lodge No. 1884 are Volunteer Veteran Drivers

The Quincy Veterans Service Office began transporting veterans to the Reno VA Medical Center (VAMC) in 1989. Then in 1996, AMVETS of California donated a Ford 7 passenger van to be used for the transports. Volunteers were recruited to be the drivers and the van was ready to hit the road to Reno VAMC. So, in April 1996, the Plumas County Veterans Medical Transport Program officially began. Between the inception of the Program in 1996 and the end of 2007 the Program has racked up 17,241 hours on the road and 395,408 miles. Past Exalter Ruler Bill Whitcher has donated ten years of time to this program. He has driven over 17, 278 miles and given over 725 hours. His time and miles have been donated to the B.P.O.E..

At the CHEA Convention in San Diego, "The Michael Manning National Veterans Coin Can" program was re-introduced as a tribute to Michael, who directed the Elks National Veterans Service Commission for over 14 years. Sadly, Michael passed away in April 2007. Mike worked closely with the organization in setting up the program; it would be an honor for every Elk to participate in his memory.

Thirty-two donation cans, on which the Elks Logo and "In Memory of Michael Manning" is inscribed, should have arrived at each lodge. All cans are to be distributed into local Mom and Pop stores, delis, etc. Each Exalted Ruler has been asked to appoint one or two Elk members to be in charge of a can for one year. This will require each volunteer to pick up the money earned in the cans on a monthly or bi-weekly basis. The money from all thirty two cans should be pooled together and deposited according to the coin program instructions that accompanied the cases.

I have asked each District National Veterans Chairman to make this a priority program for this year.

Funds generated through this program will benefit all our veterans, be it WWII, Korea, Vietnam or the Mid-East. With your support we will continue to fulfill the promise the Elks made years ago "So long as there are veterans the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks will never forget them"

Then, once they have become Elks, we must continue to ASK, ASK, ASK them to participate in our Lodge functions. If they are busy this time, ASK again.

The Membership Committee's goal is not only to increase membership, but to also keep our existing members. While recruitment seems hard; it is easier to retain an active member who can then help to bring in one more.

After attending high school in Whittier, Dave enlisted in the United States Navy for three years. While in the Navy, Dave met Rita and they were married in 1945. Their marriage brought them a son and a daughter, and now they have seven grandchildren and one great-grandchild. Dave was honorably discharged from the Navy in 1945 and resided in Southern California where he went into aircraft and worked as a tool maker for seventeen years.

In 1963, Dave and Rita decided to go into property management and have managed restaurants and apartments. They ventured on to managing mobile home parks and have been doing that for twenty-five years.

Dave joined Long Beach Elks Lodge No. 888 in 1961 and dimited to other lodges as his work locations changed. Dave went through the chairs at Diamond Bar-Walnut Lodge and became Exalted Ruler in 1991-'92. Diamond Bar-Walnut merged with West Covina Lodge at a later date.
