

Day 2: The Canyons front nine is a scramble; the back nine is individual lower gross.

Scoring for the second day is low gross for the two person team.

- Awards: 1st, 2nd & 3rd place payouts per flight. Plaques presented to flight champions.
- Mulligans: \$20 Buy-in good for for one mulligan on the front and one on the back each day.
- <u>Paint sticks</u>: \$20 per stick which allows for a "gimmie" putt within the length of the stick once on each nine of each day.
- **DRESS CODE**: Shirts with collars, no denim, no cut-offs, soft spikes only.
