Temecula Lodge Piggy Bank Chairperson Linda Jones held a "People Into Giving" fundraiser. The party raised over \$2,300.00 for the California-Hawaii Elks Major Project, affectionately known as the "Purple Pig".

California-Hawaii Elks Major Project Vision Screener, Linda Pinnell, was the guest speaker and gave an informative talk about her job and the children she works with. Linda Pinnell has been conducting children's vision screening for 39 years.

Linda Pinnell explained that during the screening she assesses visual acuity and the child's external eye health. She also evaluates the ability of the child's two eyes to work together and observes and evaluates the ability of the eye muscles to follow, fixate and maintain ocular vision. The Vision Screening Program is set up to evaluate preschool children.

It is estimated that one child in every twenty between the age of three and five has a vision problem.

With early discovery, amblyopia, often called lazy eye, can be corrected before the damage becomes permanent. Children with poor vision don't know that they can't see correctly. The California-Hawaii Elks Major Project Vision Screeners conducted 1,737 screenings at preschools last year and screened 43,830 children.

Several hundred of these children were referred on to eye professionals. Last year Linda screened over 1,200 children in the Murrieta/ Temecula area. ## LODGE DONATION PROCESSING GUIDELINES

Join the 52, Century and Millennium Clubs. Donate \$52 and receive a letter, silver lapel pin and a certificate signed by the Association President and the Exalted Ruler of your Lodge. Donate \$100 and receive a letter, gold lapel pin and an upgraded certificate. Donate \$1,000, or reach an accumulation of \$1,000 (excluding BLT donations and label/holiday card program donations) and receive a letter, special Millennium Club sparkling gold lapel pin and a special Millennium Club certificate. You may donate as many times as you would like and receive multiple certificates and pins. We also have new pins and certificates for the \$2000, \$5,000, \$10,000, 420,000 levels and beyond.

The **Lodges** may accumulate an individual's donations until they have \$52.00 or \$100.00 and then send in the money. **The Fresno CHEMPI office does not accumulate individual donations except for the Millennium Club.** 

Lodges and groups do not qualify for the Millennium Club, only individuals.

We encourage all Lodges to send in each month all 52 Club and Century Club donations along with any general Lodge donations. Smaller individual donations may be sent In or accumulated at the Lodge for 52 and Century Clubs. A check for a matching dollar amount must accompany the donor list. Smaller individual donations will not be acknowledged unless they are for memorials or other honorary donations; however they will be applied to the person's account to accumulate for the Millennium Club.

So that the CHEMPI office may ensure donations are credited to the proper member, please provide a <u>vertical</u> list of all Century Club donors (preferably in alphabetical order by last name, first name) followed by a similar list of 52 Club donors. If the individual has a common name (i.e. John Smith, Sue Jones, etc.) please list their middle initial as well. Following the 52 Club donors, please list any smaller individual donations for people not on the Century and 52 Club lists.

Some Lodges use a Century Club or a 52 Club form for each donor which is also acceptable.

<u>NEW:</u> In the past our computer system did not accept member numbers. We will soon be able to use these so please include member numbers on your donation lists, if you are not already doing so. Thank you for your help!

If an individual is donating more than one Century Club or 52 Club at this time, please put the number of clubs in parenthesis after their name.

If you are including a general Lodge donation in this check, please indicate the dollar amount included.

You do not need to cut a separate check for Century Clubs and 52 Clubs, but may do so, if that is easier for your accounting purposes.


