The Elks National Foundation continues to thrive as the holiday season is upon us. Our Mid-Term Conference took place from November 5th to 8th, in Santa Clara. During these seminars, we saw how our CHEA programs are doing at the mid point of the Elk year. Currently, our Fidelity Club membership drive is going very well. Nearly 85% of the Lodges have surpassed the 5% increase in their recurring donations for ENF. Some ideas to encourage recurring donations to ENF could include a membership drive in your Lodge, such as is done with the Purple Pig recurring donation drive. Also, how about a prize for the member who signs up the most Fidelity Club donors? There are numerous ways to increase your Fidelity Club donors, the only thing holding you back, is imagination. Finally, what better way to share the Holiday season and exhibit the act of Charity, than to make a contribution to ENF. Your donation will benefit all of the Elk programs that are dear to all of our hearts.

The current Mid-Term totals for the Elks National Foundation were announced at the ENF Dinner on Saturday night, November 8th. I know the Association Vice Presidents have been working diligently in assuring their Districts had "eye-popping" numbers to report at the dinner. We all appreciated hearing about the fine work they have been doing all year long.

The Community Investment Program Grants are currently at \$825,000, of total granted CIP funds, for about 50% of our Lodges. This is with 13% of our Lodges awaiting pending Gratitude Grants totaling another \$97,000. However, 34% of our Lodges, that are eligible for CIP Grants, have not submitted any paperwork yet. We are leaving money on the table which would assist our Lodges in providing crucial services for our communities. The deadline for Gratitude, Beacon and Spotlight grants is March 31, 2026. If you have any issues in filing out the paperwork for grants or preparing your reports, please contact myself or Steve Graham.

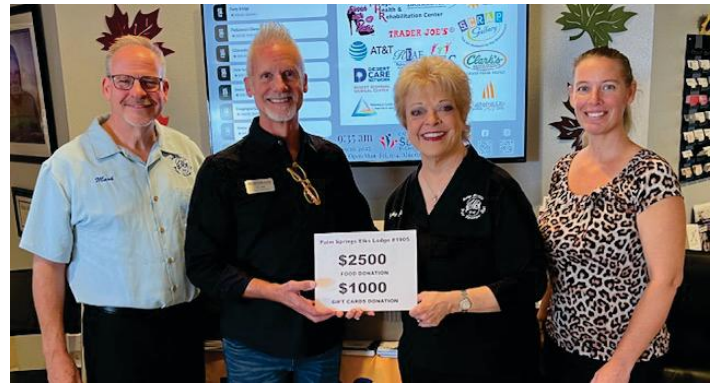

Gilroy Lodge 1567 presented a \$4,000 Beacon Grant check to One Step Closer, a therapeutic horsemanship facility. The check was presented to One Step Closer facility founders at the Gold Star Moms and Family Day. An event attended by over 110 Gold Star families, and active military from the Monterey Presidio.

In other news, the Lodge presented a check of \$5,000 to the Gilroy Branch of the Santa Clara County Library District to support the installation of storyboards in the community parks to help promote reading and literacy among our youth.

San Pedro Lodge 966 used part of a supersized Beacon Grant of \$9,500, to purchase socks and blankets to hand out at Curt's Kitchen, a hot meal and food distribution center for food insecure community members in San Pedro.



Palm Springs Lodge 1905 used the ENF Gratitude Grant of \$3,500 to donate 1,200 pounds of food and \$1,000 in gift cards for the Cathedral City Senior Center Food Bank. The Food Bank distributes over 400 meals to local seniors weekly. Clovis Lodge 2599 was able to provide backpacks with grade appropriate school supplies to two Title One Clovis schools. With the aid of a Beacon Grant, along with donations from Lodge members, and local merchants, over 1,100 backpacks were delivered to students.

In other news, the Clovis Hoop Shoot Committee and PERs proudly recognized brothers Izaiah and Bryson Powe for their outstanding achievements in the 2025 Elks Hoop Shoot competitions. Izaiah competed in the 10–11-year old boys division at the Regional Hoop Shoot in Boulder City, NV, while Bryson advanced to the National Hoop Shoot Finals in the 8–9 year old boys division held in Chicago, IL



Santa Clarita Lodge 2379 hosted its annual Car & Bike Show, which included a bake sale, boutique, live music, chili cook-off, and great food. The Lodge welcomed over 1,500 people to this community event. With seventy entries this year, the Car & Bike Show handed out fifteen awards, including one for "The Most Likely to be Pulled Over", which was awarded by a local CHP Officer. With over \$6,000 raised, the funds were split between the Purple Pig, ENF and local charities.

Last May at the CHEA Convention in Anaheim we exceeded the previous high total of four and a half million-dollars in donations and exceeded five million dollars in donations. Five million dollars is an amazing amount of money, but as we have all experienced this year, the cost of everything we purchase is continuing to increase, including what it costs to run the children's therapy program. I encourage everyone to look around and find simple things we can do to raise extra funds for the children.

You can donate as little as five dollars a month or as much as you wish. If every Elk in the California-Hawaii Elks Association would donate five dollars a month, we would raise almost five million dollars each year!

The Leading Knight's Challenge is currently going on. It ends on January 31, 2026. Last year the Challenge brought in \$284,000 in extra dollars. Check with your Lodge's Leading Knight to see what you can do to help raise extra funds for the Major Project.

I recently attended the Elks Camper Rally in Hemet, California. There were numerous games, raffles, dinners, and an outstanding magic show. The highlight of the entertainment was the annual Purple Pig Race. Several hundred Elks cheered on the Pig Jockey's and congratulated the winners. The Camper Rally was a big success!

The 57th Annual California Elks Rally took place October 9-12, 2025, in Southern California. The "Rally," as we affectionately call it, was first held in 1968 and provides critical funding for the California-Hawaii Elks Association Major Project, the Purple Pig. This program funds Occupational and Physical Therapists as well as Pediatric Vision Screeners, to help children get care they need. But, back to this year's Rally.

Over three days at Golden Village Palms RV Resort, Elks from California and beyond gathered for friendship and fun in support of a great cause. There were 342 RVs registered with other participants lodged in onsite cottages and at local hotels. Fifty-two Lodges and thirteen Districts were represented. We played Golf, Pickleball, Bean Bag Baseball, Cornhole, Bunco, LRC, and Bingo. We sang Karaoke. We applauded our own Elk entertainers during the Variety Show. We splashed around in the pool. We raced Pigs (if you know, you know). We ate amazing meals (breakfasts and dinners provided by the resort) including fresh grilled burgers and hot dogs for lunch. During the entire three-days, friends laughed together, played together, old friends reunited, and new friends were made. All in all, with activities, meals, beverages and thirty-seven raffle prizes, **the 2025 California Elks Rally raised \$101,255.55 for the Kids, for an eleven-year total of \$490,584.55.**

Each year the BPOE celebrates the outstanding achievement of its Lodges across the country through the prestigious **All American Lodge Contest "A"**.

The national competition recognizes Lodges that exemplify excellence in community services, member engagement, and organizational leadership.

WHAT IS CONTEST "A"

Contest "A" is designed to spotlight Lodges that go above and beyond in fulfilling the Elks mission of charity, justice, brotherly love and fidelity. Lodges are evaluated on a range of criteria, including:

- Community Involvement and Charitable Contributions
- Lodge Activities and Programming

For Lodges considering entering this year, now is the time to start gathering data, documenting achievements, and celebrating the incredible work done throughout the year.

Membership Retention and Lapsation

The mystique of the playful actors of 1868 continues to thrive through timeless companionship. Throughout time people like going to a safe, happy place where they may experience the atmosphere of like-minded people. Today's stories of smiles and laughter at the Lodge prove something your friends may like. You may identify the Lodge as a destination place to share time with friends and family members and to meet new people. In talking with a prospective member, you may also refer to the meaningful charitable projects of your Lodge, participation at patriotic events, and fun times at Lodge parties. When conversing with a prospective member you may have a blank application form handy. Candidates may also fill out initial applications online at elks.org. Providing information about the Elks helps candidates to be **"Sold on Elkdom"**.

While Elks enjoy New Year's Eve Parties, Crab Feeds, and Rib Fests; Lodge parties are not open to the public or to inactive members. By paying dues, active members earn the privilege of buying tickets for social events. Inactive members may not attend parties as a guest. There is no such thing as a "Former Member" who is a guest. However, inactive members may reinstate for a nominal fee and pay the current year's dues. Active dues paying members may also buy tickets for guests. (Individual bylaws may limit the number of times a guest may attend Lodge events.)

In discourse with an inactive member, you may talk about new and positive things at the Lodge. Note how the door of Elkdom can reopen for them. Give an inactive member a copy of the current bulletin, CHEA Magazine, or Elks Magazine. Explain that inactive members do not have to go through initiation again as the promise in the obligation is lasting. You may sponsor an inactive Elk back to active status by picking up an application for reinstatement from your Lodge Secretary. Encourage a buddy system within your Lodge to help inactive members rekindle the fidelity fire and be **"Sold on Elkdom"**.

Aloha Brothers & Sisters

It's that time of year – days getting shorter, weather changing, rain and snow in the forecast. Now more than ever we need to support our homeless Veterans. They'll need warm clothes and a hot meal. Reach out and partner with other local providers to help those in need.

Welcome Home Kits: Do you know what they are? Has your Lodge already experienced this? It's quite simple to do. Copy this url - <https://www.elks.org/vets/welcomehome.cfm>. Open a browser on your computer and paste it in the search window. This webpage has all the information you need. ENVSC will reimburse your Lodge up to \$400 per kit and up to \$600 for each kit that includes a bed. Partner with other organizations that support Veterans. The webpage has links to other organizations to partner with. Each kit should contain the following: broom and dustpan, mop, trash bags, paper towels, toilet paper, sponges, all-purpose cleaner, comforters, bed sheet sets, dishes, dishwashing liquid, utensils, towels, shower curtain, pots and pans, and an air fryer.

CHEA Lodges are coming on strong and showing great support for our Veterans. Here are just some of the examples:

- Clovis Lodge 2599, in partnership with the Clovis Veterans Memorial District, local Vietnam Veterans of America chapter, Fresno City and County Society, hosted the Wall That Heals October 8th–12th. The Wall That Heals is a three-quarter scale replica of the Vietnam War Memorial. It was open twenty-four hours a day.
- Roseville Lodge 2248 responded to a request to replace a dilapidated and unsafe walkway at the Vets Center. The new walkway is concrete and required close to eighty Elk hours, as well as many volunteer hours from the local community.
- Fullerton Lodge 1993 partnered with their Emblem Club to serve hamburgers to more than 200 members and families of the San Pedro Army National Guard.
- Newport Harbor Lodge 1767 collaborated with Jamboree Housing and Davy's Locker to host a three-quarter day fishing trip for sixteen homeless veterans.
- Pearl City Lodge 2669 helped with food distribution to Veterans, with 250 veterans served in July and 280 in September.
- Honolulu Lodge 616 received a Boost Grant and spent \$1,000 on garden supplies for the Veterans at the VA Community Living Center at Tripler Army Medical Center. Kailua Lodge 2230 assisted Honolulu Lodge with the project.

In closing, Vice-Chair Dan Baccelliere, and I commend the thirty-four VAVS Reps/Deputy Reps, nineteen CHEA District Chairs, and the more than 100,000 members of CHEA, for all the hard work you do in support of Veterans.

Speaking of the Enrigue Camarena Award, thank you to these five Lodges for submitting nominees this year: Richmond 1251, El Cajon 1812 – two nominations, Pasadena 672, Hanford 1259, and San Rafael 1108!

Lodges, if you haven't already done so, now's the time to print your contest entry forms for each of the four contest categories from our Committee page on www.chea-elks.org and to encourage children in your community to enter the contest that fits their age group. By doing so, you give them the opportunity to win \$400 -1st Place, \$300 -2nd Place or \$100 -3rd Place. Lodges, "get 'em now" because, just as this year's DAP contest theme reiterates: **"Drugs Are A Grave Mistake!"**

CHEA Matching Grant Applications are due December 15th to DAP District Chairs. Get an extra \$200 from CHEA for your Lodge's Drug Awareness Program by submitting receipts for at least \$400 in direct costs you have already incurred, to implement a DAP project, and get \$200 reimbursed to you! Complete the first come, first served, application available on the CHEA website.

DEA Releases National Drug Threat Assessment: Go to www.dea.gov to view the updated drug threat stats released by our DAP partner, the U.S. Department of Justice Drug Enforcement Agency (DEA). It illustrates vividly why we have a Drug Awareness Program as Elks, and why we're diligently working together to get the word out to our young people about the danger of drugs. So indeed, what we are doing by "educating students and parents, by assisting scholastic institutions with programs and materials", to quote our DAP Mission, is especially important. Thank you to all of you in Lodges throughout our Association for your efforts.
